


Homework Spring 2 2019

Reading Challenge	Research	Home Learning	Writing Challenge
Visit a library and read a book and toys, clothes or transport from the past.	Research other items from the past such as clothing and/ transport.	Your choice – what would you like to do to find out more about our topic?	Read/tell the story of Goldilocks and the three bears. Write instruction for how to make porridge.

Writing skills to practice

- Practice writing the Letters and Sounds Phase 5 tricky and high frequency words.
- Practice reading and writing a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e and u-e words. E.g. cake, these, like, home, tune.
- Practice reading and writing words with the 's' and 'es' suffix.
- Practice spelling days of the week and months of the year. Don't forget those capital letters.

Number skills to practice

- Count in 5's and 10's.
- Write numbers up to 20 in the correct formation and in words.
- Practice telling the time with a particular focus on o'clock and half past.
